

Your design is finished - WHOO!! Now what do you do?

For most projects (with the exception of a few, like websites or pieces designed specifically for print or publication) I will send you a zip folder with your final files in various formats.

"Awesome!" (but you're still confused what to do with them) So here's an quick, easy to understand quide to the files types I will send.

- .AI [Adobe Illustrator] Used mostly for/in other design or print shops, it's the purest form of your design, the OG vector file.
- .EPS [Encapsulated Postscript] Also used by and for design and print places. Also vector and can be imported into other programs outside of Adobe Illustrator.
- .PDF [Portable Document Format] We all know and use .pdf files. The .pdf's I send are always vector and can easily be sent or uploaded anywhere for print or publications.
- .JPEG [Joint Photographic Experts Group] Super irrelevant name as it only pertains to who created the standard and doesn't describe the actual type of file. This is a compressed image and only used for print if it is high-resolution! Great for use in digital media (i.e. emails, documents, social posts, etc.)
- .PNG [Portable Network Graphics] My personal favorite type of flattened image, mainly because it allows for a transparent background (whoo!) which means it's best used for things like websites or any type of digital layering that you don't want an ugly white box behind your image.

Be sure to SAVE your files to a location on your computer you can easily remember!
